

Voting App – Enabling Online Students to have iClicker-like Group Experiences

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Instructor View

(1) First, instructors log into the Voting App.

(2) Then, hit the "Group" button.

(3) Create as many empty groups as needed for your course. (We recommend you plan 10 students /group.)

(4) Students are automatically put into groups at the start of term when they first register into the Voting App. You can automatically shuffle students into different groups any time during the term.

(5) Create multiple choice quiz. Select correct answer. Save or delete the quiz. Use "Export" to move resulting grades to .csv file.

(6) Tie your Voting App quiz to material in your Learning Management System that students see.

6 Your Recommendations

Step 6a. What Should You Do?

As you continue to discuss with your Slack team, begin Step 6a by logging onto the Voting App. If you have not yet registered for the Voting App, follow the instructions available on the course homepage under Getting Started.

The best approach is to have Slack open side-by-side with the Voting App on your screen. You might also want to have an Internet tab open with the learning goals for this module displayed, so that your decision-making as a team is as informed and efficient as possible. Make sure that you know how the Voting App works for your team, so that you don't risk losing points. Once again, the place to go is Getting Started.

When you log into the Voting App, click on "open" next to the current module step 6a, where you will see the following choices:

Choice	Text
A	I have not made a decision yet...
B	Get going right away before any fog develops.
C	Stick to the plan. Go for a short walk and head off after breakfast (~10:30). It's probably just a morning outflow which should be slowing down.
D	Leave around 12:30. The winds might have died down by then.
E	Spend the day exploring Bowen Island and leave around 17:00.

Don't forget to hit the "My choice is final" button in the Voting App, otherwise your vote isn't saved. Please note that the deadline for Steps 5-6 can be found in the course Schedule on our homepage.

(7) Students register at start of term. Then login for each quiz.

(8) Next, they select which quiz to debate with their team.

(9) Online students use Slack or Mattermost to debate online with their group mates...

... while they vote on the Voting App.

Points	Rubric
0	If you did not vote on the Voting App.
1	If your answer is wrong, regardless of any others in your group who got it right.
5	If you are the only person in your group with the right answer.
6	If you had the right answer, along with 1 other person in your group.
7	If you had the right answer, along with 2 other people in your group.
8	If you had the right answer, along with 3 other people in your group.
9	If you had the right answer, along with 4 or more other people in your group.

(10) As students debate and change their decisions, the Voting App shows the live vote tally. Student GRADES depend on how many group mates reach the correct decision.
